- * Patricia Peppin, Director of Student Financial Aid (acting position was made permanent on July 1).
- * Spencer Peterson, Director of Enrollment Services at Red Mountain.
- * Note: The Athletics Department reports directly to the Vice President of Student Affairs.
- "A key responsibility of Student Services is the handling of student grievances and judicial processes," said Pattie. Student grievance and judicial processes will be handled by Judy Taussig at Southern and Dobson and Joni Grover at Red Mountain.


New director of Career and Re-entry Services

Parking added at Southern and Dobson

What's happening to the parking lot near the football field (Lot C)? All of the islands have been removed in order to create additional parking spaces. Removing the islands will create approximately 100 new parking spaces. There will be an estimated 1,279 unrestricted spaces (i.e. student), 76 restricted spaces (i.e. employees and visitors), and 28 handicap accessible spaces.

Several other parking lots have also seen changes. Parking lots H, G, F, E (south of Studio 28, Theatre, Arts and Communications, and Technology) as well as the employee parking lot B (north of EF Bldg.) have all been resurfaced and re-striped.
